Uniform Policy - An Update

I am writing to inform you that a change has been made to our summer uniform. For ease, the updated part appears in bold below (the full policy can be found on our website).

Summer uniform:

During half term 6 only (after May half term break), students can wear our summer uniform if they wish to do so.

The summer uniform is either:

• The coloured House polo shirt with either trousers, skirt, <u>tailored</u> school shorts or <u>tailored</u> school skorts (PE skorts are not allowed). No logos are permitted on shorts or skorts. Sports shorts or lycra style shorts are not permitted.

OR:

• White shirt (long or short sleeved) with either trousers, skirt, tailored school shorts or tailored school skorts (PE skort is not allowed).

Summer school uniform is an equally important element of the school's vision and values as our main school uniform and therefore should be worn correctly with equal pride. The purpose of our summer uniform is to optimise students' comfort during the warmer months of June and July by creating an environment where students can thrive academically while remaining comfortable throughout the school day. Students can still choose to wear their full uniform (tie, blazer and jumper) if they wish. On days, when students have PE, they should still bring their usual PE kit for this lesson. Students should change after a PE lesson to maintain hygiene, prevent body odour, and promote a fresh, comfortable learning environment for themselves and their peers. Students are expected to continue to wear black school shoes during the summer uniform period.

Trainers are not permitted when wearing summer uniform.
