

Dear parents, carers and students,

I thought it might be useful to write to you with some reminders about the start of term and to share with you the amazing outcomes of our sixth form and Year 11 students.

Year 13 students had much to celebrate as they opened their A-level results, with 25% of their overall grades at A* or A!

Students will be travelling to universities and apprenticeships across the breadth of the UK including Cambridge, Durham, Imperial College London, Newcastle, Warwick, Aberystwyth, Manchester, Leeds and York universities. A wide range of courses will be studied including Medicine, Politics, Philosophy and Economics, Mathematics, Physiotherapy, Engineering, Psychology, Fine Art, Geography, Theoretical Physics and Zoology.

Year 11 students were also celebrating with a record number of students achieving 5 or more strong passes in English and maths enabling them to progress onto Post 16 studies and apprenticeships.

We are incredibly proud of them all!

Uniform and Equipment Expectations

As a reminder all students are expected to return to school in their full school uniform (blazers, shirts and ties).

Changes to the school day

As shared with you in July, from September there will be a minor adjustment to the school day, this is to bring Sherburn High School in line with the government directive that schools offer 32.5 hours per week to students.

Period one will now start at 8:30 a.m. and our staggered end to the day will begin at 2:45 p.m. with all students being dismissed by 3:00 p.m. School buses will continue to run as normal. Extracurricular activities will therefore start at 3:00 p.m. and end by 4:00 p.m.
