Safeguarding Update – Launch of "Tell Us"

The 'Tell Us' service is for students (parents and carers) to safely submit any safeguarding concerns confidentially, on line. We've adopted this strategy as students sometimes find it difficult or uncomfortable talking to an adult so may find it easier to send an email. We also know from our conversations with parents and carers, that sometimes if the concern is not in relation to your own child, that you are worried that you might be seen to be "meddling" or you're not sure who to report your concerns to.

Someone might want to complete a "Tell Us" form if they are worried about: bullying (online or in person), have a concern about a friend, or about something that happened online or a person might want to report a particular website that has been viewed or it could simply be because something just doesn't feel right.

No-one should keep concerns to themselves, "Tell Us" so that help and support can be provided.

When completing the form, you don't have to provide a name or email address. Without this information the form will be completely anonymous however, if you do wish to be contacted about your message then these must be included.

Please also continue to contact your child's Head of Year and form tutor about concerns – this feature is just an additional tool, to add to our safeguarding procedures and doesn't replace our current practice.
