

Term 1 Achievements

As we approach the end of an extremely successful term, I wanted to reflect upon the many individual and collective achievements of our students. Whilst our students continue to achieve magnificently well in the classroom, as you will see below, there have also been a range of achievements that have taken place outside of the classroom:

- Within our first Assessment Point cycle, over 97% of our students in Years 7 11 have Attitude to Learning only containing 3s and 4s!
- Over 60% of our students have attended a wider-curriculum activity (with Chess Club and Football proving to be the most popular!) this is a remarkable achievement from our students and evidences their commitment to pursuing their passions.
- Our student voice and Student Leadership teams have already had an impact with changes to the Personal Development Curriculum, school dinner menu and an enhanced awareness of Equality and Diversity by all within our school community.
