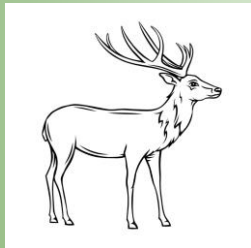

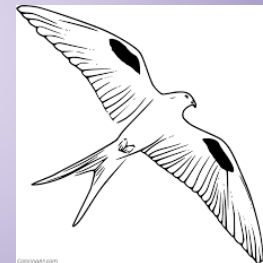

NEWBY = Train

(Newby Hall miniature railway)

The Newby Hall Miniature Railway which runs along the River Ure, is a delightful ride with fantastic views of the gardens.

The Railway first opened in 1971, originally an end to end line, built by Cromar White. The line, now extended runs parallel to the river in the shape of a dumb-bell loop and operates every day of the season.





BRAMHAM = Horse

(Bramham Horse Trials)

Built in 1698, and famous for its 66 acres of formal French gardens, Bramham Park is a family home that is much sought after for a range of occasions.

The horse trials first ran in 1974, as directed by the owner at the time, George Lane Fox. It began with only 25 horses taking part, but has grown considerably over the years, and gained international status in 1981.





LOTHERTON = Stag

(Lotherton Deer Park)

The estate is home to an extensive collection of endangered bird species and a herd of red deer.

The deer park was created in the early 1980s.

A herd of deer was initially moved here from Temple Newsham estate. Later yet a herd of red deer were introduced to the estate and they are currently the only species to still be present there.





HAREWOOD = Red Kite (bird)

(Famously fly on the Harewood estate)

Red kites are a magnificent sight that can be seen hovering above the Yorkshire countryside.

With a wingspan of over 1.5 metres, they are one of the UK's largest birds who nearly became extinct in the 19th century.

In Yorkshire, conservationists started a breeding program that re-introduced the red kites at Harewood House in 1999.



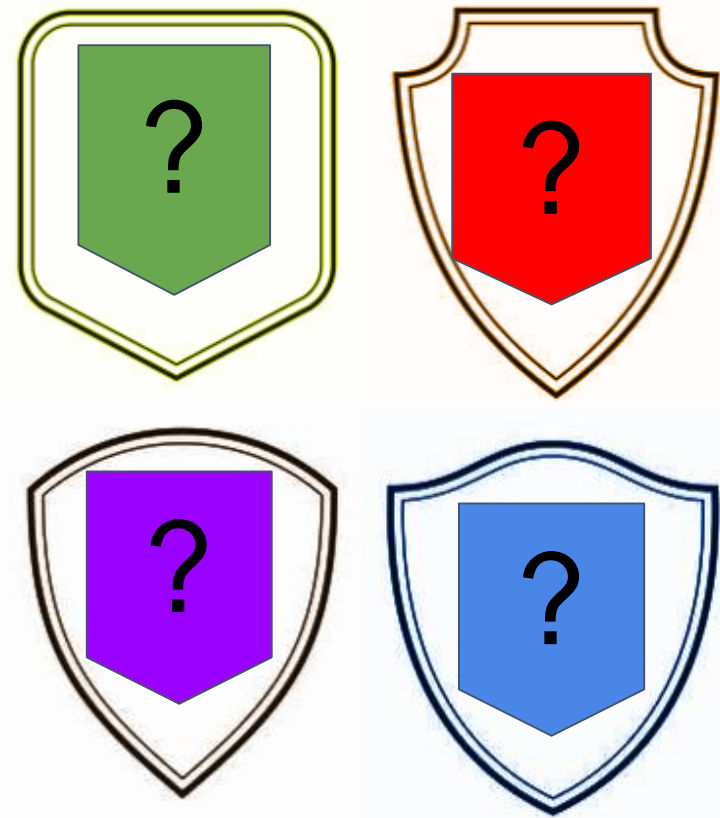
The Harewood estate is a perfect home for the kites with its large woodland and agricultural land.

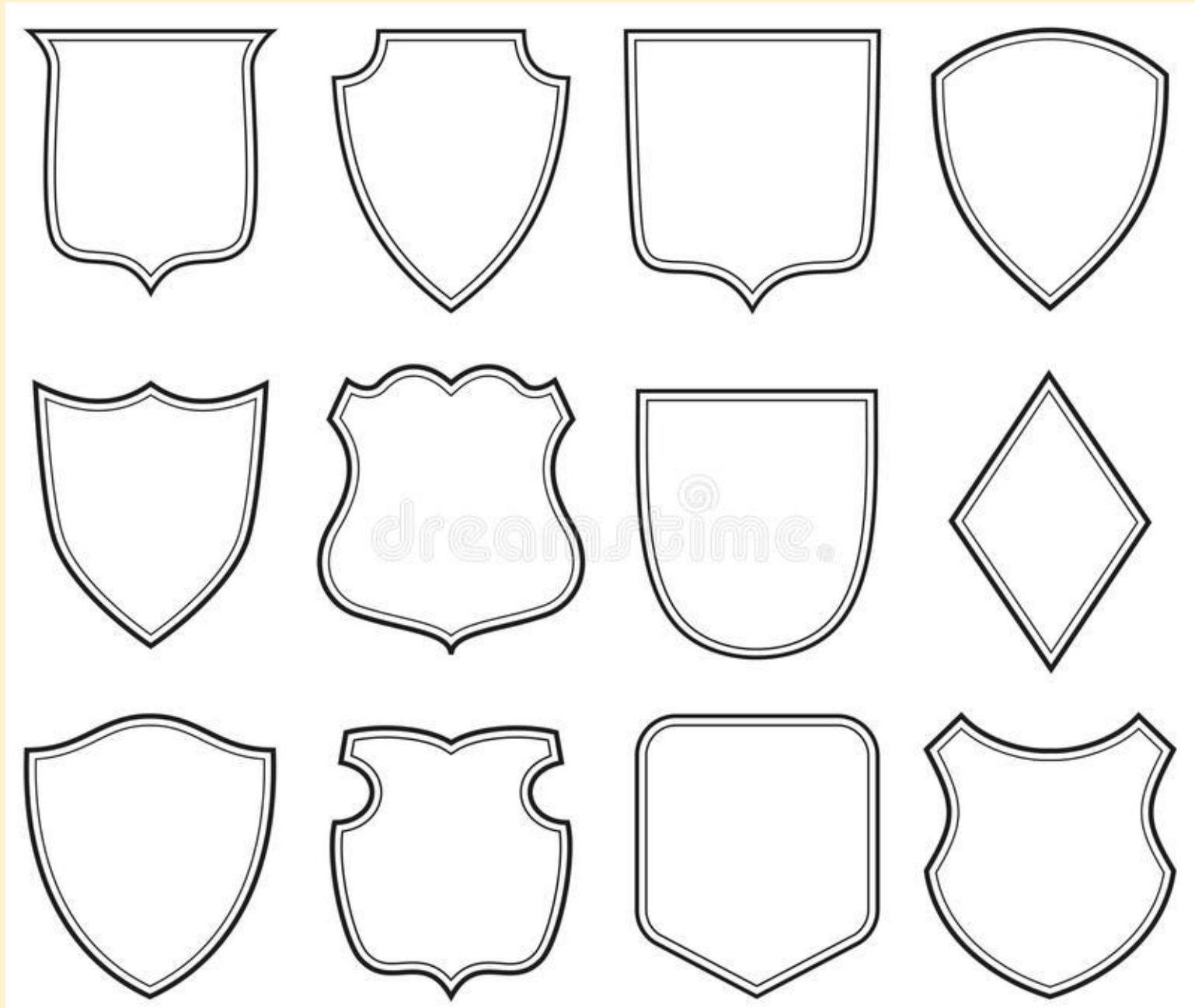

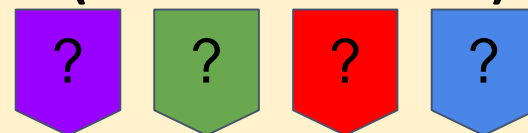
