Dear Parents/Carers

Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme – Bronze Award

I'm pleased to let you know that we intend to offer the Bronze Award over the course of the next 12 months. The DofE is a great chance for your child to broaden their horizons, discover new interests and talents, have fun with friends, develop essential skills for their future and achieve an internationally renowned Award. As DofE Coordinator, I wanted to send you some information about what a DofE programme involves, the benefits for your child and how they can sign up.

About the DofE

The DofE is non-competitive and open to all young people – it's about setting personal challenges and pushing personal boundaries. There are three levels of DofE programme which, when successfully completed, lead to a Bronze, Silver or Gold Award. Through their DofE, students will make friends and memories and build traits like confidence, resilience and self-esteem, which can benefit mental health. They'll gain skills and attributes for work and life, like problem-solving, team-working and self-motivation – and they'll achieve an Award that's recognised by top employers and can help them stand out when applying for university or jobs.

To achieve their Bronze Award, participants must complete four sections: Skills, Volunteering, Physical and their Expedition. Every young person's DofE programme is personal to them – they can choose what they'd like to do for their Skills, Volunteering and Physical sections, and most activities can count. We will provide guidance and support, and students can either choose to continue an activity they already do or discover something completely new. Activities for each section take a minimum of one hour a week over a set period of time, so they can fit around studying, hobbies and social lives. Expedition Dates

The Bronze package consists of registration, 2 days training and a 2 day 1-night qualifying expedition.

The dates in the table below are fixed and students should not enrol onto the award if they cannot commit to them. Students will be required to undertake both the Practice and the Qualifying expedition.

There will also be an afterschool meeting to form walking groups and discuss the expedition programme once registration has closed. More information will be sent out at a later date with regards to this. **Signing up**

The total cost for registration, administration, training, insurance and provision of transport/personnel for completing both expeditions will be £265 and to make paying easier and faster, all payments will be collected via ParentPay which can be accessed on the school website or you can visit <u>www.parentpay.com</u>. The registration fee of £50 is included in the total cost and covers the cost of the welcome pack (registration onto eDofE & student log book), insurance and school's administration fees and is **non-refundable**. The remaining costs cover tuition,













transport by minibus, use of equipment, fuel, appropriate external supervision and external assessment. The final cost must be paid before Friday 1st March, 2024 and student's accounts must be up to date to allow them to participate on the expeditions. Financial support may be available for students eligible for free school meals. For further information on this, please contact me via my email at <u>dofe@shs.starmat.uk</u>.

The expeditions are supervised remotely using checkpoints and visits and staff camp on the same campsites as the groups. Photographs may be taken for promotional purposes such as the school's website. If you do not want that to happen, then please let me know by adding a comment to the enrolment form.

We will commence the expedition training in March 2024 but students will be enrolled onto the scheme as soon as they sign up and any section activities that they may have already been doing will count from the start of the academic year. It is hoped that many students will see the benefits of the award programme and commit to completing the Bronze Level. If you would like your child to confirm their place on the award please complete the slip below, log onto ParentPay and pay the registration fee of £50. Please also complete the attached DofE enrolment form and medical forms. To speed up registration, you can take a picture or a scan of the completed forms and email them to me at dofe@shs.starmat.uk. Alternatively, forms can be dropped off at school reception. The closing date for applications is **Friday 10th November, 2023**.
