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## Policy Aims

School uniform is an important element of the school's vision and values. Therefore, all students are expected to wear their uniform correctly and take an active pride in their appearance. The school is a place of work and students' standards of uniform are expected to reflect the important nature of learning as well as appropriate health \& safety considerations. Students are expected to respect and comply with the school uniform policy and will be sanctioned if they do not meet the agreed standards.

The School Uniform Policy supports us to:

1. Promote a sense of community and belonging to the school
2. Engender a sense of pride in, and loyalty to, the school
3. Enable students to feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance
4. Avoid discrimination and promote fairness and equality

The school uniform is also designed to be practical, cost effective and gender neutral.
All students should wear their uniform and conform to the policy when attending school, when representing school externally or when participating in an event organised by the school outside of school hours, unless permission is granted by the school to do otherwise.

All parents and carers of students attending Sherburn High School are expected to support the school by ensuring that students conform to the policy. All staff will support the Uniform Policy by promoting and maintaining high expectations with regard to uniform in lessons and around the school in general.

The School Uniform Policy will be dynamically reviewed regularly to ensure it reflects fairness, sensitivity and meets legislation. The school follows the following government guidance, School uniforms - GOV.UK to ensure that the school uniform is gender neutral, inclusive and financially accessible.

In addition, we want to be able to offer families choice when purchasing school uniforms.
As a result of this, our policy means that the only garments that are required to be bought from school are the following:

Uniform that are purchased directly from school are:

- School badge (optional item for non-badged blazers)
- School tie in House colours

| Summer uniform | After May half term students may wear a Sherburn High <br> School polo shirt in the appropriate House colour. The <br> wearing of the SHS polo is entirely optional. Blazers are <br> not required to be worn in school after May half term. <br> Students must return in September of each academic <br> year in their full Sherburn High School uniform. | Optional |

|  | A coat, gloves, scarf and hat may be worn for inclement <br> weather. These are not to be worn inside the classroom <br> or around school. <br> Baseball caps are unacceptable at any time. | Optional |
| Jewellery/Make up clothing | Hoodies should not be brought into school or be worn on <br> the school site (except from the Year 11 hoodie which <br> may be worn by students who have met the set criteria) | Ideally no jewellery should be worn. <br> A watch (not a smart watch), and a single pair of plain <br> ear studs (not hoops/rings/flesh tunnels) can be worn, <br> one in each ear lobe. No other items must be visible. |
| Ideally no facial make-up; where this is worn, it should be <br> very light and discreet. Fake eyelashes, fake tan should <br> not be worn | Compulsory |  |

| Hairstyles and colours | Nose piercings should not be worn. If students do have <br> this piercing, then it must be removed for the school day. <br> Tongue piercings, facial jewellery or similar body <br> piercings must never be worn. Any new piercings/flesh <br> tunnel procedures that require a 'healing period' should <br> only take place during school holidays that are long <br> enough to accommodate this healing process. All <br> piercings (other than ear piercing as stated above) must <br> be removed and not simply covered up with plasters <br> during school time. <br> No jewellery should be worn during physical education or <br> other practical activities. <br> Clear nail varnish is permitted. 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Students may wish to wear an alternative or additional garment (e.g. headscarf) for faith reasons. Where this is the case, permission should be sought from the school in advance.

Parents are asked to communicate with the school which religious items they would like their child to wear and the reasons why. The school may refuse permission on health and safety grounds but where it is granted all such garment items must be plain black with no logos or patterns.

The school can support students that are not in correct uniform by providing items to borrow until the correct items are purchased or worn.

Students that do not follow the school's uniform expectations will be subject to the school's behaviour procedures following the B2B system. This can result in after school detentions or isolation sessions.

## School PE Uniform

The School PE kit aims to be practical and smart, balancing the demands of physical exercise with personal comfort and confidence for the students.

PE uniform requirements fall under the oversight of the PE Department and are subject to their assessment of the sports being participated in and the conditions prevalent at the time of year.

## Sixth Form Dress Code
